Stanislav Shekshnia is director of the Executive Board Programme by SEI and INSEAD as well as INSEAD's Leading from the Chair Programme. Apart from his academic career, Shekshnia has a corporate background, having held various management positions at Alfa-Telecom, VimpelCom, Millicom International Cellular, Otis Elevator, and SUEK. Currently he is a senior partner at Ward Howell talent equity advisory and serves as chair of board of directors of the Russian Fishery Company.

Stanislav Shekshnia will for the first time in Norway present new insights about the future of board work and board leadership based on a research project launched by INSEAD Corporate Governance Initiative. The report **Board Chairs' Practices across Countries: Commonalities, Differences, and Future Trends** builds on this research.

The speaker will present and compare the specific practices and instruments used by board Chairs in executing their role and the attributes that make Chairs effective. The session will also present trends facing the work of the Chair in the next decade.
